

ORDINANCE NO. 40

**FRONTAGE AGREEMENT ORDINANCE
PREAMBLE**

Lakeside Water District is a duly organized Rural Water District pursuant to the laws in the State of Illinois, and is authorized to enact ordinances. At this time, Lakeside Water District services numerous water customers who have installed private water lines from Lakeside Water District mains. These private water lines, which were installed at the customer's expense, run across their property to their residence or other location where water is utilized by them.


WHEREAS, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency has, pursuant to Environmental Protection Agency statute, issued regulations which provide among other things, that private water lines which run across the land of a third-party must be legally permitted water mains. These regulations do not contain language commonly referred to as a "grandfather clause" which would allow existing private lines which run across the land of third parties to be exempt from this requirement.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE LAKESIDE WATER DISTRICT BOARD, THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE CONCERNING THIS MATTER.

"Water Line Frontage Ordinance"

SECTION 1: Private water lines, which run across the land of another, must be permitted by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and any other applicable governmental entities. Any private water line(s) which are not permitted as of the date of this Ordinance and which run across the land of a third party, shall, at the user of the line's expense, become permitted lines and comply with all governmental requirements. In the event that the user or users of such a line do not take the necessary steps so that their private water line becomes a permitted water line, Lakeside Water District has the authority to cease servicing this water line. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the date of its enactment by the Lakeside Water District Board.

Passed, approved and adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Lakeside Water District, Jackson and Williamson Counties, Illinois, this 11 day of FEBRUARY, 2003.
